



INTERESTING OBSERVATIONS FROM EDUCATORS

- Cybersecurity trainings need to be adapted groups of learners with different levels of IT competences
- Adult learners are often more prone to understand cybersecurity threats if they understand how it impacts them as an individual, and not as an organization
- Cyberbullying is a growing threat to individuals of all ages, and staying safe from it requires more than just technical skill: it requires being more careful about what one does online
